The conference continues a series of scientific events under the general title “Visual Anthropology”, started in 2014 in Tomsk¹.

The focus of the conference is a multidisciplinary study of the visual parameters of culture as a sphere of human communication in relation primarily to the urban environment.

The space of the city is interpreted as a complexly organized dynamic system of visual signs and symbolic locations expressing and transmitting cultural and anthropological meanings, values and practices.

Strategic objectives of the conference:

- development of regional, federation and international scientific cooperation in the field of humanitarian problems of modern urban studies
- creation of a scientific and discussion context for the exchange of research results between Russian and foreign scientists in the field of theory and practice of the formation of public urban spaces
- analysis and systematization of current problems, trends and results in the field of cultural topology of the city at the regional, national and global levels
 - convergence of fundamental urban studies with social and administrative practices in the modern city.

The scientific objective of the conference is to determine the actual significance of the modern historical city as a place of representation, translation and generation of the code (codes) of cultural identity.

During the conference it is planned to achieve the following results:

- formulation of the concept of the cultural code of the historical city
- conceptual substantiation of ways and forms of actualization of cultural heritage as the basis of modern urban identity
- defining the role of the university in the process of generating the urban cultural code
- identification of the special place of the Russian historical city in the cross-cultural processes of modernity
- development of measures of positive influence on creative practices related to the organization, transformation and optimization of the urban environment
- conceptual correction of activities in the field of management of urban cultural processes.

The following sections are expected to work:

SECTION 1

CULTURAL IDENTITY: URBAN ASPECTS

Historical city as a form of expression of cultural identity. The cultural code of the historical city: Russia and Europe. Visualization of basic cultural and historical meanings and values in the structure of urban space. The relevance of the past in a modern historical city. Urban perspectives of cultural heritage.

SECTION 2

POLITICA URBANICA

The political subjectivity of the historical city: a place in the political and symbolic space of the past, present and future (city-symbol, city-brand, city-image, city-text, etc.). “The rights to the city” in the strategies and models of the future (smart cities, sustainable cities, healthy cities, etc.). Designing a city—designing the future: problems of modern architectural and urban planning policy (training of specialists, training of municipal authorities, training of the public). “New citizens” (migrants, students, tourists): identity politics as an aspect of preserving the history of the city. Peter the Great as the designer of the city, the designer of the future (for the 350th anniversary of his birth). The past and future of the city as an arena of political struggle offline and online.

SECTION 3

UNIVERSITY TRADITIONS AND HISTORICAL CITY

The social institute of school, urban space and cultural environment of the European city from Antiquity to the present day. University as a phenomenon of urban culture in Western Europe. Adaptation of the university idea in the cities of Eastern Europe: form and content. Non-institutional forms of education in the urban environment. The cultural code of the university in the historical and modern city.

SECTION 4

ANTIQUITY AND THE MIDDLE AGES IN A MODERN CITY

Multicultural space of Antiquity and the Middle Ages in modern cities. Ancient and Medieval allusions and reminiscences in modern cities. The Old Town in folklore, literature, art and cinema.

SECTION 5

HISTORICAL AND CULTURAL CONTEXT OF MODERN URBAN PRACTICES

Holidays of the national calendar in the past and present of the city. Traditional culture and folklore in urban space. Citizens in suburban practices (trips “to nature”, picnic, dacha). Ethno-

confessional ceremonies and religious practices in the modern urban community. Urban folklore movement between authenticity and subculture. Role-playing games and historical reconstruction in a modern city.

Cultural centers, educational institutions and colonies of Russian emigrants as points of growth of the urban environment and urban life. Places of memory of Russian emigration in European urban spaces.

A collection of materials will be published based on the results of the conference. The deadline for submitting materials for publication is October 10, 2022. The volume of materials is no more than 10,000 characters. Requirements for the design of materials can be found in Appendix 2.

The conference participants will have the opportunity to prepare detailed articles with a volume of 20,000 to 40,000 characters based on their reports and submit them for publication in specialized scientific journals: *Urbis et Orbis*, *Microhistory and Semiotics of the City*, *Journal of Visual Theology*, *Paradigma*, provided that the requirements for the submitted materials are met and the content of the articles corresponds to the subject of the journals.
